Dear Friends

I was glad when they said to me, 'Let us go to the house of the Lord!' (Psalm 122:1 NRSVA)

We are on our way back!

Our journey is careful and it is tentative, but bit-by-bit we are returning to the house of the Lord.

People flocked to Jesus because they were in need. Often the need which people had identified was physical rather than spiritual. That kind of hunger is still with us. The Food Bank is seeing a slight further increase in demand, but it is progressively helping younger clients, particularly those whose furlough has come to an end but who have no job at the end of the furlough. Today we have been separately visited by Borough & City Councillors seeking to promote this work, and by the 'African Network' bringing a huge delivery.

As I write, Zeph's has completed three days of trading. We owe a huge debt to Penny, and most especially to Michael for the immense effort to get us to this point. Thank you. Turnover has been helped by the new government scheme. It has been helped too because we've welcomed back old friends. If you are venturing forth why not give it a try.

We've agreed next steps to getting external hires underway. We will need social distancing and thorough cleaning to become ways of life, but the building is beginning to emerge from hibernation.

Most importantly, our new way of worship is starting to take shape. Those of you physically unable to get to church will not be abandoned: we are moving to mixed-mode worship. We will still be on zoom and frequently our preachers and readers will be remote too. Joyously, it means that we can also welcome those without the technology to zoom with us: they can be in church in person. A few of us will be in the building to trial the technology this week, but we aim to be properly up and running from the 30th August.

We also want to gather for prayer. We are aiming to have our Saturday morning prayer group meeting from the beginning of September.

The Psalm which I quote above is described as a "Psalm of Ascents" or perhaps a "Pilgrim Song" and this verse speaks about going to the house of the Lord. However, the Psalm is intended to be sung after the worshipper has already visited the Temple. It is about using the time of worship to refresh us and inspire us to take Good News to others. Let's make sure that we do so.
