Dear Friends

Lift up your hands in the sanctuary, and praise the Lord! (Psalm 134:2 NIV)

There is a scene in “The Lion the Witch and the Wardrobe” in which it becomes apparent that the reign of the White Witch is coming to an end. The snow is beginning to melt and the world seeks to return to normal. It feels a bit like that now. However, the parallel goes beyond that: the start of the thaw was just the beginning. Lots still needed to happen before “normality” could be restored. (Yes, I have read a lot during my week’s break; no, Narnia wasn’t one of the things which I re-read!)

We have used the church building for our act of worship. Our test event on the 16th August was reasonably successful, albeit with some inevitable teething problems. There were eighteen of us in the building and nearly fifty online. We will therefore go ahead with opening for worship this Sunday (30th) and will continue in mixed-mode with worshippers able to participate remotely.

However, please be aware of the limitations: those in church must wear masks, sanitise their hands on arrival, sit where they are directed, they cannot sing, there is no coffee available, and little opportunity to chat. Feedback from those attending was understandably diverse. Some thought that the precautions meant that it felt safe to attend. Others found the limitations deeply uncomfortable. We are trying to strike a difficult balance here and must comply with our moral and legal responsibilities.

Please continue to participate in worship remotely if you possibly can, so we can use our limited capacity for those who can only attend in person. Whilst we maintain social distancing in church, our capacity remains severely restricted.

The “thaw” is commencing in other areas too:

- We hope that the Saturday prayers will start soon: we are aiming for 19th September. Don’t forget that this ministry has also continued throughout lockdown and resources will still be available if you want to pray with us without coming onto the premises.
- Zeph’s is reopen. People are gradually regaining confidence to come in and are really appreciative of the way in which we are able to provide space to remain safe. Fish Fryday was an immense success with 53 attending.
- We’ve got our first external booking back. It will be a long time before the building is back to being the brilliant community hub that it was at the start of the year, but this is an important milestone.

These steps are dependent on a huge amount of work which has been done on our behalf. I will single out Jon & Eliza for all the work they’ve done to make it possible for external bookings, to thank Penny for her tireless efforts for Zeph’s, and to thank Barry for taking on the role of COVID officer... but in doing so, I know that there are others who I could also name whose work has also been wonderful.

We are also reminded of the extent to which the world needs to see the compassionate results of us following Jesus. The Food Bank saw eight new client families last week.
