Dear Friends

Blessed are those who mourn, for they will be comforted. *Matthew 5:4 (NRSVA)*

Good grief.

No, that is not simply an expression of surprise, but an invitation to reflect on how we draw good out of our grief. We need to transform the sadness of loss into the joy of thanksgiving – or at the very least find comfort.

As most of you will have heard by now, my mum died last week. In one sense it was unexpected: when she went to sleep, nobody had any expectation that she would die that night; she simply didn't wake up in the morning. Nevertheless, it was not altogether a surprise. Mum was weak and frail, she had been in hospital for several weeks, and the fact that she couldn't have visitors added to the confusion caused by her affliction with dementia.

The pain of loss is offset a little from knowing that 2021 was going to be a tough year for mum. As her dementia progressed she would inevitably have to move from the only house my parents ever owned: the one which they bought in 1961 and in which I had grown up. She might well have faced that move whilst we were still suffering Covid restrictions on visiting. During 2020, two of her grandchildren had married and she had seen her two great grandchildren. (All those on my brother's side of the family!)

I'm grateful that she and I had taken the advice which I often give to families: we had talked about her funeral and we will get as close to her wishes as Covid restrictions permit.

Not for the first time, I will be taking a funeral where the words that I say will be inspired by things written in the Bible which was by the bedside. In her final months she was upset that she struggled as she said her prayers each day.

I know that there will be days when my emotions are more troubling than they are I as I write this. I know only too well that grief and loss can be much worse than this.

Yet, I hold fast to my faith, and give thanks for hers, and I acknowledge the way my Christian journey began in the Methodist Chapel where she first took me all those years ago, and where we will say our goodbyes.
